**"ON THE STREET and IN THE CLASSROOM"**

We are excited to announce that L.E.A.D. (Law Enforcement Against Drugs) is launching its IN THE CLASSROOM and ON THE STREET Programs in your state.

L.E.A.D. is a rapidly growing 501 (c) 3 nonprofit providing the only evidence based proven effective K-12 curricula to law enforcement in the United States. We are providing services in thirteen states and the District of Columbia.

Our IN THE CLASSROOM program is in conjunction with the Mendez Foundation's Too Good Family of Curricula. The program offers separate age appropriate K-12 curricula of ten lessons broken down into two training options. The one day training model is for any officer that has been in the classroom prior and has been certified by another school based prevention organization such as NASRO. The other model is a five day Instructor training for officers that have never been in classroom.

Our ON THE STREET Program (information attached) is open to all law enforcement officers that serve your agency.

L.E.A.D. provides positive influence in a community and starts in the schools. L.E.A.D. is the only Law Enforcement led, Drug and Violence Prevention charity offering proven effective evidence based K-12 curricula that is on the various federal agencies as being effective. This program is designed so that children are receiving the most effective training in drug prevention, decision making, peer pressure refusal and it develops a constructive relationship with Law Enforcement.

On December 5<sup>th</sup> we will be in Los Angeles at the University of West Los Angeles (9800 La Cienega Blvd., Inglewood, CA 90301, 10am-4pm), and December 12<sup>th</sup> Tracy Police Department (1000 Civic Center Dr. , Tracy, CA 95376 10am-4pm) offering our one-day training for officers and teachers. After completion of this one-day training your officer or deputy will become a certified L.E.A.D. instructor.

We are also pleased to announce that we have retained the services of Scott Gilliam as our Vice President of National Training Operations. Scott is a former LAPD officer and was the first officer to start an International Drug Prevention program in 1983. For 33 years he worked in this field and is internationally recognized as an expert trainer.
